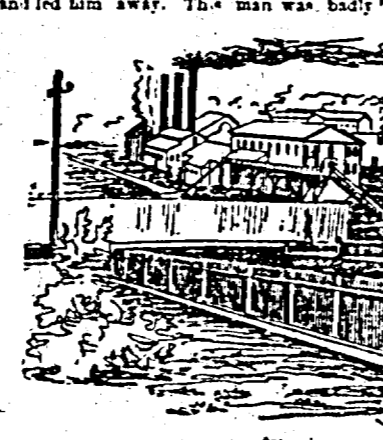

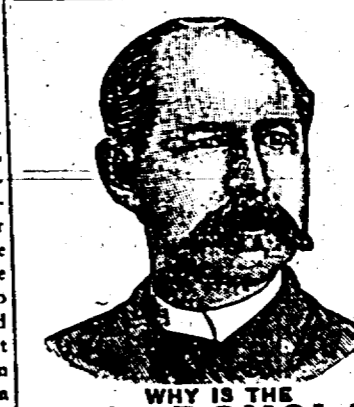

THE BROOKLYN DIVINE'S SUNDAY SERMON.

SUBJECT: "THE GREAT QUESTION" (PREACHED IN ENGLAND.)

Text: "What shall I do with Jesus?"

There are two unprincipled politicians. He has sympathies, unprincipled of right, and desires to be honest; but all these are submerged by a wish to be popular and to please the people.

There is something of a question, but one that throbs with war and a quick pulse in the heart of every man and woman here.

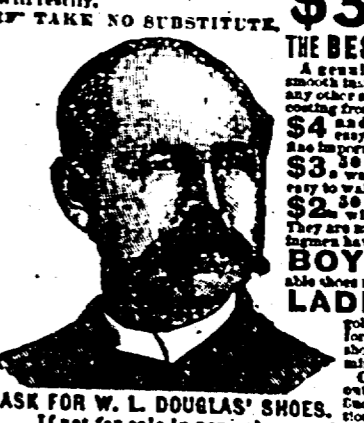
