ckness in the Wake of the Flood-500,000 Aeres of Grain Destroyed -Frightful-Suffering in the Submerged Districts.

The steady rainfall in the Southwest for the past few days is causing the gravest alarm, and the worst is evidently yet to come in the skinning of the great rivers. But little kies of the extent of the flood But little ides of the extent of the noon in the upper Mississippi district can be extend. From the sity of Atton on the lili-nois abors to St. ( harles, 12 miles from the mouths of the Missouri, the country is one vast body of muldy water. The water has worked its way around the high land, and for miles lack of these citles the country is inundated to a digth of from two to six feet.

inuadated to a dipth of from two to six feet. The same condition of affairs exists for many miles down the river toward St. Loua, aud should the flood berin to recede, it will be many weeks before the river will have preturated to its regular channel. The amount of damage and suffering canced by the overflow can acarcely be esti-mated. The whole country is a desolate waste. Hundreds of families are driven from their homescheir live atock drowned and crops destroyed. In many places the swift current has washed away entire farms, and the channel of the river will never be restored to its original course.

and the channel of the river will never be restored to its original course. To add to the serious condition of the people, sickness has overtaken them to an alarming extent. They have been living in improvised huis, tents and poorly con-structed buiklings, and as a result of ex-posure to the inclement weather of the last wretk, many families are suffering from fevers, pneumonis and other sickness inci-dent to the wet weather. Already the cry of distress and appeals for relief have been sounded, and the inhabitants are now de-pendent upon the charity of their fellow people.

### Foreigners in China.

In view of the suggestion tha. China might possibly retaliate against the United States for the exclusion of the people of that country from our borders by expelling our cliizens now resident in the flowery land, there is inuch interest in a report newly ren-dered to the department of state by United States Minister Denby. According to his statement fliere are at present in China only 1022 citizens of the United States, nearly half of them women. Of this number 400 reside at Shanghai, 186 at Tien-Tsin and 63 at Canton. Nearly one-half, 506 in all, are missionaries, 28 are in the diplomatic and consular service, 6 are mining engineers, 23 are in mercantile occupations, 28 are in the Chinese customs service, 73 are seafaring men,

7 are ministers, 5 are machinists, 2 are professors and 345 are "unela-sified." According to the report of the inpector general of customs at Shang-hai there were in China, in 1890, 1153
